CALLED TOGETHER FOR A NEW VISION

Just a thought!

As I sit and write these notices I am reflecting on Moses encounter with God which I read the other day in the Bible. This encounter was not meant to boost Moses' ego, it was to give him a mission. Moses put up as many objections as he could, his lack of position or power, his doubts about whether his people would follow him, his slowness of thought and speech. Modesty may be a virtue but playing down and undervaluing our abilities to avoid responsibility is not. But there are two questions within this interplay with God, and Moses asked them both. "Who am I? " and "Who are you?" Basic questions in all human relationships and particularly in our relationship with God. Or maybe they are two sides of the same question.

"Who am I" As I stare at the computer screen I ask myself that question, the truthful answer is that as immortilised by the Beach Boys song 'God Only Knows'. I can define myself in relation to my familly, colleagues, friends. I can see myself in what I write and when I study but only God knows who I truly am. Most of us are generally unknown quantities with depths only God can penetrate. Ultimatly who we are is meaningful only in our relationship with Him, even though it is expressed through relationships with our families and other people.

Then there is the second question which is even simpler and yet more complex. When Moses asked God "What is your name" he was asking about the very nature of God. Moses was asking for certainty, a money back guarantee on God's nature, but he didn't get it. God replied with the demands of faith. All he would say was "I will be with you." Confirmation would come after the event, that had to be enough for Moses and has to be enough for us. In an age where science provides us with so much information about the world we live in we assume that we have a right to know everything, but God simply says "Trust me". It worked for Moses even as it turned his life upside down. Life is always turned upside down when you trust God but many of us would say that faith really turns life back the right way up!
